Essential Public Health Services (EPHS)

#1 Assess & Monitor

- Provided vision and hearing screenings for school age children.
- Continued to monitor cases, deaths, and community levels of COVID-19.

#2 Investigate & Address Health Problems

- Investigated complaints regarding housing and food establishments

#3 Inform & Educate

- Provided guidance and education on QRT visits
- Educated clients on STI prevention

#4 Strengthen Community Partnerships

- Conducted the vision screenings at all schools in partnership with the South Milwaukee Lions Club .
- Kicked off Health Community Partnership meetings to review Assessment data and establish health priorities,

#5 Utilize policies, plans, & laws

- Updated standing medical orders
- Utilized Municipal Ordinances to enforce orders from complaints

#6 Improve and Protect

- Provided training, education for use of Narcan
- Distributed Narcan to trained individuals
- Offered and provided vaccinations to residents for COVID-19 and Flu

#7 Enable Equitable Access to Services

- Offered a variety of settings and times for COVID-19 clinics in coordination with Zone E Health Departments

- Nursing team member initiated training for certified lactation consultant
